Careers talks for the children

Following the success of our Mystery Reader scheme (thanks to the generosity of parents), where parents liaised with class teachers to come and read their favourite book to the class, we would like to roll out a similar scheme regarding Careers. In the past, parents have come into school to talk to the children about their careers. The children loved it! We want to encourage our children to think about future jobs, whilst nurturing aspirations and challenging stereotypes and help to open up a world of possibilities. After February half term, we would like to invite you to come into school and talk to your child's class about your job. The talk should include your role, the qualities, skills and qualifications needed for the job and what you enjoy about the job. Props, pictures, uniforms etc are most welcome. If you are interested and could spare the time to come and talk to the children, please see Mrs Fletcher or your child's class teacher to arrange a mutually convenient slot or to discuss further.

Learning about British values

Our school is always striving to improve and enhance children's learning experiences. Following our most recent Ofsted inspection it was noted that to improve further - "The school should develop further opportunities for pupils to learn about all of the British values, to support pupils to develop their understanding of the world around them". Therefore, we will be providing further opportunities for the children to experience the wider world around them. Following on from our trip to the mosque there will be an opportunity each academic year to visit a different place of worship covering the diverse range of religions in Britain today. Guest speakers from different faiths and cultures will be invited in to talk to the children about their beliefs and cultures. Workshops to celebrate diversity with LGBT groups are also planned for the future. Our KS2 children have a planned trip to Morpeth County Hall to speak to councillors regarding the democratic processes. Our KS2 children will also be asking the Councillors questions about the issues that concern them right now for example climate change, environmental issues, deforestation, farming and homelessness. These are just some of the strategies that we are employing to address our next steps.

On Tuesday 11th February, children will be marking Safer Internet Day. This year's theme is 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online'. Ford Castle

Next academic year our Year 3/4 class have the opportunity to go on a 2-night residential trip to Ford Castle. The trip will take place from Wednesday 29th April to Friday 1st May 2026. Everything is included in the cost of the camp at Ford Castle, with accommodation, activities, equipment, food and drinks all covered in the price per person. The cost of the trip will be £275.00 per child. The initial deposit is due in March and we will require a non-refundable payment of £50.00 per child paid to secure their place on the trip by Monday 3rd March 2025. A Parentmail consent form has been set-up for parents to complete.

Promoting Pleasure in Reading - World Book Day & Book Fair

On Thursday 6th March we will be celebrating World Book Day 2025. Children are invited to come to school dressed as a character from one of their favourite books and will engage in reading activities throughout the school day.
