PARENT CONSULTATIONS

Y2 ASSESSMENT MEETING FOR PARENTS

The meeting will be an opportunity to discuss national expectations and see examples of test papers and ask any questions. RESIDENTIAL FOR Y3 /4 MEETING FOR PARENTS


There will be a meeting for parents Thursday 19th March at 6pm regarding the Y3/4 Robin Wood trip. This will be an opportunity to ask any questions regarding the trip to Robin Woods on 4th, 5th and 6th May.

YEAR 4 STATUTORY MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK

In the week beginning 8th June, all Year 4 children will be required to participate in the new national statutory multiplication check. The purpose of the Multiplication Tables Check is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. The Multiplication Tables Check has been described as "an online, on-screen digital assessment" - meaning the children will take the test on a desktop computer, laptop or tablet (such as an iPad) at school.

The times tables test will be timed, with the entire assessment lasting approximately 5 minutes in total. The children will be set a handful of practice questions before they begin the test. Following the





practice questions, the test itself will comprise of 25 questions, all formatted, for example, as $2 \times 5 =$ with the child required to input the result. Children will be given six seconds to answer each of the questions, with a three second blank gap between each question. The questions will be randomly selected by the testing programme from 121 different options, ranging from $2 \times 2 =$ up to 12×12 . The software has been programmed to show children more questions from the 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12 times tables, as these are trickier times tables focused on more in Years 3 and 4. Results from the test will be reported to parents with their end of year reports.

WORLD BOOK DAY



STAYING SAFE. SPEAKING OUT NSPCC VISIT

The NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe programme is visiting our school to make sure our pupils have the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse.

I'm pleased to tell you that we will be working with the NSPCC, the UK's leading children's charity, who will be delivering their Speak out. Stay safe. programme on Friday 27th March. This is a nationwide





programme for every primary-school-aged child in the UK and Channel Islands. With the help of their friendly mascot Buddy, they'll be presenting an assembly to the children in our school as well as a workshop for Years 5 and 6.

Through child-friendly, interactive assemblies and workshops their specially trained staff and volunteers will give our children information about how to keep themselves safe from harm and how to get help if they have any worries, sensitively discussing issues like bullying and sexual abuse, without using scary words or adult language. We have studied the content of the materials and heard from other schools who have participated and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of their visit, we are convinced children will feel empowered - knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.


