## Sports Premium

The government has provided additional funding to schools for academic year 2016 to 2017 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. This funding is to be spent on improving the provision of PE and sport in schools. We are received a total of £8245 for the year 2016-17.

Increased opportunities for children to take part in competitive sports and extra- curricular clubs organised and delivered by specialist teacher.	£4900	100% of the children in our school benefitted from quality PE teaching provided by our specialist during the course of the year, with all children participating in this inclusive curriculum. Almost all children have made good progress in PE throughout the school. A new scheme was prepared by the specialist for our school ensuring progression of skills over the years. Our subject leader was given the opportunity to work alongside our specialist for CPD to observe good practice. The teacher was able to organise competitive sport competitions with other local schools for KS1 and 2. The specialist teacher also offered extra-curricular clubs for each alternate half term.

Further extra -curricular rugby sessions were also promoted after these lessons. All our KS1 & 2 children made good progress in learning a new skill, developing hand-eye co-ordination and playing and improving in a competitive sport. Children took part in an activity that they would have otherwise may not have experienced.

These activities also had a positive impact on developing skills of team work, co-operation, resilience and tackling challenges with a positive attitude all of which were applied back in the classroom.

<ul> <li>Increasing opportunities for children to take part in extra-curricular sports clubs .</li> </ul>	£810	All of our key stage 1 & 2 children have had the opportunity to take part in sporting extra-curricular clubs. Greater awareness of health issues and promotion of healthy lifestyles and physical well-being and cultural understanding. Clubs included gymnastics, African dance disco dancing, rounders, rugby, football, break dancing and hockey. Over 50% of our school have taken up an additional extra-curricular sporting activity. Extra -curricular clubs have been offered in sports and signposted where not available in school to improve children's enjoyment and engagement in physical activity promoting healthy lifestyles. These clubs have also offered the opportunity for children to take part in inter-school competitions.

In the forthcoming year we intend to spend the money on:

- ensuring quality provision and progression is in place as we take on our first Year 5 children.
- increasing the opportunities for inter-school sports competitions
- provision additional sporting experiences in a physical activity children may not have experienced through extra-curricular clubs
- developing 'Little Leaders' sports scheme to develop and instill leadership qualities.
