


As they tidied, Dipal took out some toys they no longer used and put them in a box. "We can give these toys to someone else to play with and we'll have more space!"

Diwali tea light holders



Salt dough recipe

1 cup of flour

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup salt $\frac{1}{2}$ cup water

- 1. Mix the salt and flour.
- 2. Gradually add the water until it comes together to form a dough.

Demonstrate rolling the dough into a ball and then make the ball flatten slightly –you can be inventive a make different shapes with the dough.


Once your happy, push a tea light candle gently into the dough until the top is level with the top of the dough.

Take the tea light back out and allow the tea light holder to dry for 1 week in a warm spot .

Once it is fully dried, paint the base coat on the pot with acrylic paint. When it's dry add dot patterns or other patterns to finish the tea light holder.




