Flu vaccinations for Reception to Year 5 children, whose parents signed and returned the form in September, will take place on December 11th.


## Non-uniform Day

Swarland Primary School is accredited with the Healthy School Award. To support this we are committed to promoting healthy lifestyles. # <u>Health & Safety</u>

## Additional funds for your child

If you receive any of the following, you may be entitled to receive a free school meal and additional funds which come to school to support your child. You can apply for free school meals if you receive any of the following:

Income Support.

Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance.

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance.

Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.


The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit.

Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of £16,190 or less

Working Tax Credit 'run-on' - the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Universal Credit - In England, if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get). If your child is





currently eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2022.

These could be used to support music tuition, trip coats and residential and booster groups. To make a claim please contact the Local Authority or contact the school office for further details.
