As a result, in our continued drive to be the best that we can be we will:

- children's progress reports will be issued to parents each term alongside termly parent consultations, sharing learning sessions and informal opportunities to drop in to see the class teacher.

# <u>Homework</u>

As a school we value the contribution parents make in supporting their child at home with their learning. We believe fostering a healthy approach to working at home and at school is essential to developing a good work ethic. Therefore children in year 1 to year 6 will receive grammar homework on a Monday and mental maths homework on a Wednesday using the Schofield & Sims workbooks. Reading should take place at home each evening. Reception children will receive phonics homework each Friday as well as daily reading. Children in Years 5 & 6 will receive additional homework to prepare them for high school. If you have any queries regarding homework please see your child's class teacher.







### Home time arrangements

If your child has any change to their home time arrangements or pick up, particularly if your child is changing their bus routine, please could you inform the school office at your earliest convenience. We cannot accept a child informing a member of staff, it must be the parent. Thank you for your co-operation.

### Medication

If your child requires prescribed medication such as an inhaler, school medical forms need to be completed before school staff can administer them. These are available on request from the school office. Please be aware that these need to be renewed at the start of each school year.

#### Wellington Boots

Please can all children including those in Reception ensure they have a pair of wellington boots in school for outdoor learning, that remain in school during term time. Thank you.

### <u>Year 5 & 6</u>

May I also remind parents of children in Year 5 & 6 that they are allowed to walk home alone with a signed permission form. If you require one of these forms, please see the school office.
