## Behaviour Policy Additional Items due to Covid-19

In light of the need for children to behave differently when they return to school, and new systems which are required by Government to be put in place to support pupils, families and staff safety, we have had to adapt our behaviour policy.

However, there is now additional behaviours in red that are required from children during this pandemic.

#### Good behaviour

Good behaviour. We believe that this behaviour helps us to be safe, happy and to learn. This is what we want to see in our school:

- 1. Listening carefully.
- 2. Doing as you are asked by an adult.
- 3. Always trying your best and helping others to do the same.
- 4. Telling the truth.
- 5. Being polite and kind to others.
- 6. Moving safely around school following the directional arrows and distancing measures.
- 7. Use the social distancing measures in the playground when it is time to line up
- 8. Treating others' property carefully and only using your allocated resources.
- 9. Only play with the children in your group as directed by your adult.
- 10. Always sneeze or cough into a tissue then bin it, where possible and then wash hands.
- 11. Avoid touching your mouth, eyes and nose and putting resources into your mouth.
- 12. Do not bring in toys or pencil cases from home, use the school resources provided for you.
- 13. Only 3 children allowed in toilet area at one time
- 14. Always wash your hands coming into school, before and after playtime and lunchtime, after toileting and before you go home.

#### Consequences:

- You will be keeping yourself and others safe
- You will be able to learn and help others do the same. This will help you have a happy time at school.
- You might get a reward from your teacher.
- If you work hard and behave very well you may receive a special reward in our Shining Star assembly on Fridays.

## Warning Behaviour -

Warning behaviour. We believe that this behaviour is harmful to a happy, safe and purposeful learning environment and therefore we do not want to see this in our school. This includes:

- 1. Interrupting or talking over an adult.
- 2. Running in school.
- 3. Saying unkind things or calling names including online.
- 4. Hurting others.
- 5. Stopping others from learning.
- 6. Not treating the property of others carefully.
- 7. Threatening to break one of the good behaviour rules.

## Consequences:

- You will be reminded that your behaviour is not acceptable.
- If you have been reminded and you do not stop, it could mean that you have a time out or miss a playtime.

## Stop! Behaviour -

Stop behaviour. This behaviour is unacceptable, compromises safety in our school and will have serious consequences. This includes:

- 1. Refusing to follow an adult's instructions, arguing back or rudeness.
- 2. Deliberately hurting someone.
- 3. Swearing.
- 4. Bullying including cyber bullying.
- 5. Telling lies.
- 6. Stealing.
- 7. Breaking or deliberately damaging someone else's property.
- 8. Racist behaviour.
- 9. Inappropriate language
- 10. Deliberately not following the good behaviour expectations.

#### Consequences:

- You will definitely need to have a time out of your classroom or playtime.
- The Head teacher will want to talk to you.
- Your teacher or Headteacher might need to ring your parents and let them know.
- You may miss out on further privileges in school.
