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### School Dinners

This half term, as the winter approaches our school dinner menu will offer jacket potatoes for each lunch alongside our usual menu. ## Punctuality and Attendance

Please may I remind parents that school and lessons begin at 8:55am. We are seeing increasing numbers of children arriving at school after this time. It is very important that children are in at the start of the day with their peers to establish routines and set out the expectations of the day. Children should be in school and ready to start their learning at 8:55am. Doors open at 8:45am to allow children time to organise their belongings before lessons begin. Five minutes late each day is 25 minutes of lost learning each week.

At Swarland Primary School our attendance records have historically been above the national average. However, Governors are noticing an upward trend in the number of children taking leave of absence during term time both authorised and unauthorised. Parents must be made aware that persistent absence is measured as 10% of school sessions missing. In these instances the educational welfare officer and school will follow the Local Authority's procedures to protect the children's education and secure a successful outcome.
